

YOU ARE YOUR PATIENTS TRUSTED VOICE!



Physicians, pharmacists, and their teams are the most trusted voices on vaccination:

- Often have established relationships with patients
- Often reside in the same community as patients –understand local concerns
- Viewed as trusted medical experts
- Can personalize recommendations for each patient's needs
- Can effectively address concerns and counter misinformation

Even with today's shifting vaccine policy environment and the flood of widespread and targeted misinformation, a clear, confident recommendation from a healthcare professional remains one of the strongest influences on whether someone chooses to get vaccinated. This is true across patient groups—and is especially impactful for communities with historically lower coverage, including people of color.

With limited time in busy clinics, the biggest gains come from a whole-team approach. Pairing proven tools (reminders/recall, standing orders, portal outreach) with trusted community partners (faith leaders, educators, public health) has boosted vaccination rates by about 20–40% in [NMQF/SHC DRIVE sites](#), with continued gains in underserved communities.
